Residential Estimating

Updates to the RI Residential Building Code

This class will explain the changes happening when Rhode Island moves from the present 2021 RI Residential Building Code (SBC-2021) to the new 2025 RI Residential Building Code (SBC-2025). The material will include the updates to the residential building code and what RI Amendments have been added, amended or deleted.

Wall Construction in the Building Code

The class covers Chapter 6 of the RI One and Two Family Dwelling Code regarding the design and construction of wood, cold-formed steel, masonry, concrete and structural insulated panel (SIP) walls, and covers code changes pertaining to the new wind charts. Chapter 6 also regulates exterior windows and doors installed in walls.
