September 1 | 8am-10:30am

Introduction to the Design-Build Process

2 ½ credit hours — taught by Joe Cracco

In this 2.5-hour intro class, presenter Joe Cracco will describe what the Design-Build Process is, discuss its many benefits as well as who's involved and what they do. The course concludes with an overview of the 4 steps in the process. This course is a prerequisite for the 5-hour Advanced Design-Build class in which will go into the 4 steps in significant detail. (Note: this is the intro class; the advanced class will be held on October 14th)

September 8 & 9 | 8am-3pm (both days)

OSHA 10 Training

OSHA 10 card is issued. (IN PERSON) Taught by Scott Asprey

Occupational Safety and Health Administration's (OSHA) Outreach Training Program's 10-hour safety course covers general safety and health hazards for entry-level workers.

September 10 | 8am-10:30am

Air Sealing Methods for the Energy Code

2 ½ credit hours- taught by Larry Desormier

Attention: Builders, Remodelers and Building Officials! This class addresses air sealing methods for the 2024 Energy Code. It will provide an overview of air sealing methodologies and techniques to comply with the 2024 IECC air leakage requirements including both the prescriptive requirements and air leakage testing. This class is an NAHB training module (#2) in partnership with RIBA.

September 11 | 8am-10:30am

Building Planning

2½ credit hours – taught by Larry Desormier

This class covers Chapter 3 of the Rhode Island One and Two Family Dwelling Code including design criteria and minimum fire separation for townhouses and one and two family dwellings.

September 17 | 8am-10:30am

Framing the Future with SIPS

2 ½ credit hours- taught by Frank DiMauro (IN PERSON)

If you have not heard of or not using SIPS (Structural Insulated Panels), you should attend this class. It is a growing trend, and many feel it is the future of framing for both residential and commercial structures. SIPS can also be an easy way to help you to meet the new 2024 energy code requirements.

HR Law Class for Small Business

Business No RI credits for this class – taught by Gary Convertino

This class focuses on employment law and how that impacts employee/employer relations in the workplace. Additional information will be provided about the changes to the RI 1099 independent contractor laws.

Learn how the principles of Advanced Framing boil down to simple field-applied details that are easy to incorporate and code compliant.
